## EFFECTIVE WAYS OF TEACHING ENGLISH ONLINE

Every teacher can use Google Apps for collaboration with students. This might come as a surprise entry into this list but Google's app suite is spectacular when it comes to the ability to distribute lessons and have students collaborate. Teaching a foreign language online is made much easier by the tools that Google is providing. Here are just a few of their apps that can be used in foreign languages teaching.

**Google Docs** – Lets you send and receive written assignments, syllabi, resource lists, instructions and more.

**Slides** – Create PowerPoint style presentations, can be used by teachers or to have students create a presentation on a subject related to the language they are learning in that language.
